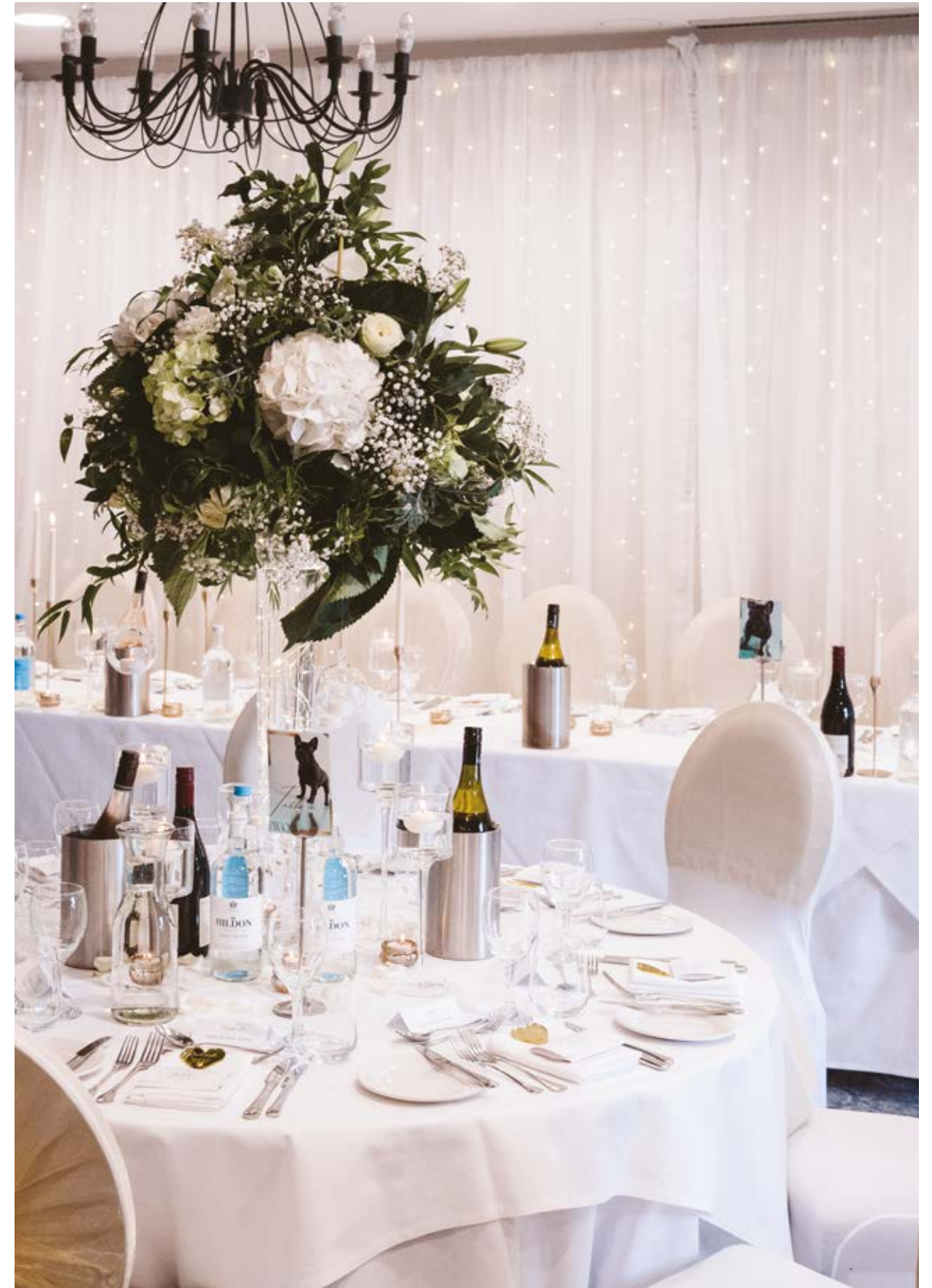




The Library

Our History.

Originally owned by Chertsey Abbey in the Middle Ages, the mercurial 18th century politician, Charles James Fox, after whom the property is named, came to live in the area in the 1780s with his mistress, and former courtesan, Elizabeth Armistead. A brilliant young parliamentarian (MP for Midhurst aged just 19), Fox was a passionate orator with an appetite for gambling and the high life.

Up until the early 19th century, the area known today as Foxhills, was part of the Botleys Estate. The land was owned by Sir Joseph Mawbey, a close friend of Fox. On the death of Mawbey in 1817, the estate was broken up with Sir Joseph's son-in-law, John Ivatt-Briscoe, a successful lawyer and local MP, buying the land...

1840

In 1840, Ivatt-Briscoe commissioned the architect, George Basevi (cousin to Benjamin Disraeli, twice former PM), whose work included Ely Cathedral in Cambridge, to build the current manor house using Bath stone and Suffolk brick.



1870s

In the 1870s, the estate was passed to a distant relative of Ivatt-Briscoe, General Hutton. A veteran of the Zulu and Boer wars, Hutton took an active role in parish life and invited the families of men who fell under his command to play in the grounds.



1920s

The estate was sold to the Borthwicks, a successful merchant family, in the 1920s. Unchanged since Ivatt-Briscoe, with a staff totaling 15. During WW2, the family energetically turned the farm over to the 'Dig for Victory' campaign.



1960s

By the 1960s, the estate had fallen into decline, and it was sold to Aer Lingus; the national airline of Ireland. The airline, looking to diversify, opened two golf courses in 1975, although it was not the immediate success the company had hoped for.

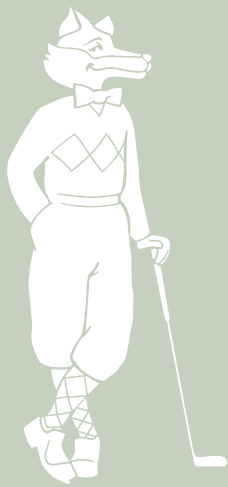


1983

Foxhills was sold to Pam and Ian Hayton in 1983, who modernised the club with inspiration from US country clubs to give families a place to feel they belong.

In 2005, their son, Marc, took over as Managing Director (now current CEO) and continues to grow Foxhills as Surrey's leading club and resort with more than 200 weekly activities for its members & guests to enjoy.
